PAST SIMPLE

Two examples of PAST SIMPLE tense:

- They went to London with two friends last summer.
- •We stayed in a hotel near Hyde Park.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



DAST SIMPLE - FORM

AFFIRMATIVE

We add –ED to REGULAR VERBS.

She studied very hard for her exams.

 We use the SECOND COLUM for the IRREGULAR VERBS.

Peter left his job last August.



PAST SIMPLE - SPELLING

PAST SIMPLE - FORM

NEGATIVE

 We make the negative form of the past simple like this:

SUBJ + DID NOT (DIDN'T) + BASE FORM

I didn't visit New York last summer because I was ill.

She didn't tell her friend the truth.



PAST SIMPLE - FORM

INTERROGATIVE

 We make the interrogative form of the past simple like this:

[QUESTION WORD] + DID + SUBJ + BASE FORM?

Did they write to Tom? When did Shakespeare die?

SHORT ANSWERS

Yes, I / he /she / they did No, I / you / it / we didn't

(+) SHORT ANSWER

| Yes, | I was. |
|------|--------------------|
| | you were. |

(-) SHORT ANSWER

| No, | I wasn't. |
|-----|-----------------------|
| | you weren't. |
| | he / she / it wasn't. |
| | we weren't. |

| | they weren't. |

PAST SIMPLE – USE

We use the Past Simple for finished past actions.

Liz lived in London two years ago. She had a fantastic time there. (Liz doesn't live in London now).

 We use the Past Simple to list a series of completed actions in the past. To tell a story or to talk about history.

He arrived from the airport at 8:00, checked into the hotel at 9:00, and met the others at 10:00.



The typical time expression for Past Simple are:

- Yesterday
- Two days / one week / fifteen minutes AGO
- LAST August / weekend / year
- In 2002 / On 21st July 1897 (DATES)
