This computer is better than that one. She's stronger at chess than I am. It's much colder today than it was yesterday. Our car is bigger than your car. This grammar topic is easier than most others. She's looking happier today. This grammar topic is easier than the last one. Russian grammar is more difficult than English grammar. My sister is much more intelligent than me. I find maths lessons more enjoyable than science lessons.

Superlative sentences

In the superlative you talk about one thing only and how it is the best, worst, etc. You do not compare two things.

My sister is the tallest in our family. Yesterday was the coldest day of the year so far. Some people think that Russian is the most difficult language. Albert Einstein was the most intelligent person in history. My most enjoyable class is English. You are the most irritating person I have ever met!
