# **INFINITIVE (TO INFINITIVE)**

### • <u>Verbs followed by a gerund:</u>

Admit, advise, anticipate, appreciate, avoid, can't help, complete, consider, delay, deny, detest, discuss, dislike, enjoy, finish, forget, hate, imagine, keep, like, love, mention, mind, miss, postpone, practise, prefer, quit, recall, recollect, recommend, regret, remember, resent, resist, risk, stand, stop, suggest, tolerate, understand.

l <u>enjoy swimming</u>.

Students *detest doing* homework at the weekends.

### • <u>Preposition + gerund</u>

They apologized <u>for not paying</u> the bill. Peter doesn't like Anne's way <u>of thinking</u>.

## • As subjects of a sentence (they become nouns)

**Breaking** up a relationship is never easy. **Smoking** is not allowed.

### <u>Verbs followed by an Infinitive</u>

Afford, agree, appear, arrange, ask, beg, care, choose, claim, consent, decide, demand, deserve, expect, fail, forget, hesitate, help, hope, learn, manage, mean, need, offer, plan, persuade, prepare, pretend, promise, refuse, regret, remember, seem, struggle, swear, threaten, volunteer, wait, want, wish.

Alice **promised to arriv**e on time. Mary **<u>decided not to take</u>** the car.

## • After adjectives or adverbs

This text is <u>difficult to understand</u> The car went too <u>fast to see</u> the traffic lights
