
Countable and Uncountable Nouns

COUNTABLE NOUNS

 Countable nouns are nouns that we CAN count. They have singular and plural forms.



UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

 Uncountable nouns are nouns that we CAN NOT count. They ONLY have singular form.



There is / There are (HI HA)

We use **there is** and **there are** to say that something exists. We use **there is** for *singular* and **there are** for *plural*.

Examples

There is one table in the classroom. There are three chairs in the classroom.

There is a spider in the bath.

There are many people at the bus stop.

There is + a contable and uncontable nouns.

There are + a contable
